"When listening to Ilić's new CD with 22 (out of the total of 53) Chopin studies, you might well add: And Ivan Ilić is currently Godowsky's most worthy and committed advocate. Very rarely is Godowsky heard in such a devoted, serious, precise, but also warm and easy manner. Ilić's velvety, romantic (not romanticizing) sound refines Godowsky's recreations, defined by Ilić as "ingenious commentary" on the original studies. The care and intensity with which Ilić plays the studies surpasses mere technical mastery. Ilić's recording is permeated by Godowsky's soul in the same way that Godowsky's Studies are imbued by Chopin's soul.

"The pristine sound of the recording contributes to the consistently positive overall impression in no small measure: this is the only way to experience the "Ilić miracle", which leads you to listen spellbound to the good 70 minutes of the CD without having to remember even once that it was recorded exclusively with the left hand were, without having to remember even once that these are some of the most technically demanding works of the entire piano literature.

"The bottom line is technical brilliance and expressiveness: Ivan Ilić embodies the virtues of a complete pianist in an impressive manner. Moreover, he does it with a technically extremely demanding program with almost incredible ease, and only with the left hand. However: What is spectacular about this CD, is not the fact that it was recorded with the left hand alone, but Ilić's intelligent and at the same time poetic playing."
